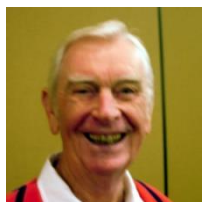


Wayne Holm 1930 to 2019

He was doing well on Thursday and then took a turn for the worse and passed Friday evening. His wife and daughter were present at the hospital.

Wayne was a wonderful individual who had a terrific knack for the game of bridge. He was a marvelous ambassador for the game. He was a gentle man who took many of us under his wing so that we could learn from a master. He began playing at the Monday game about 13 years ago and rarely if ever missed a Monday. When he came to a table he always had a quiet, warm greeting for those he played against. In all the years we knew him we never heard him raise his voice, complain about a partner or an opponent. He was just a gentleman who really knew how to play the game. He set an example for how the game should be played. We have lost a very nice man, a superior bridge player and a good friend to many of us. There will be an empty chair at the next Monday game, one that can never really be filled.

Wayne was a Gold Life Master who amassed close to 3,000 master points. This year alone he already had 383 master points. That is a lot of winning bridge. Why not; he was a winner in all aspects of his life. He turned 89 in August.
